Policy and Communications Internship in Washington, DC

Since 1999, the Foundation has supported on-the-job experience for graduate and undergraduate students through the NASF Internship Program. Students engage at the national level in legislative, policy and communications activities that influence the future of state and private forestry.

Executive Fellowship, John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University

In partnership with the U.S. Forest Service, the Foundation offers a fellowship to attend a program for senior executives in state and local government at Harvard University. The three-week session focuses on exercising leadership and uses a case-study approach in designing solutions to real-life problems.



Forestry Photography Fellowship

In an effort to help illustrate the story of forestry in the United States, the Foundation awards a fellowship to photographer on a biennial basis. The photographer documents the forests of each of NASF's three regions. The photographs are available for use by NASF, all 59 member agencies and NASF partners.
