# **Program Highlights**

#### Forest Health Protection

Continued focus on eradication of Asian longhorned beetle in Worcester County. Gypsy moth defoliation was down statewide, with 159,705 acres mapped in 2018. Oak mortality, likely driven by gypsy moth, occurred on 23,602 acres. Surveys for southern pine beetle found only four beetles in 2018. Biological control efforts for emerald ash borer, hemlock woolly adelgid, and winter moth continue across the state.

## Forest Stewardship

The Massachusetts Forest Stewardship Program reported 224 new/revised stewardship plans for 24,740 acres of which 12,141 acres were in Important Forest Areas per Massachusetts's Strategic Forest Action Plan; and 2,986 landowners took part in educational programs. Massachusetts has an on-going landscape scale restoration projects project "Small Forest Landowner Outreach Initiative for Communities Located in the Urban-Rural Interface of the Quabbin to Cardigan Priority Landscape" designed to empower landowners of small woodlots (10 to 25 acres) to engage in coordinated forest management, combat invasive species, and provide heat to neighbors in need.
